## Honey bee

Watch out! My yellow and black stripes are a warning that I sting. Some hover flies copy this colour, but they don't sting. Honeybees have 2 pairs of wings, but their hoverfly mimics only have 1 pair.

Where did you find me?



Fun Fact! I'm bright green with tiny black dots and dark wings. The wings aren't completely covered by wing cases, so you should be able to see them folded over my back.
