# MAIN ENTRANCE

## Entrance

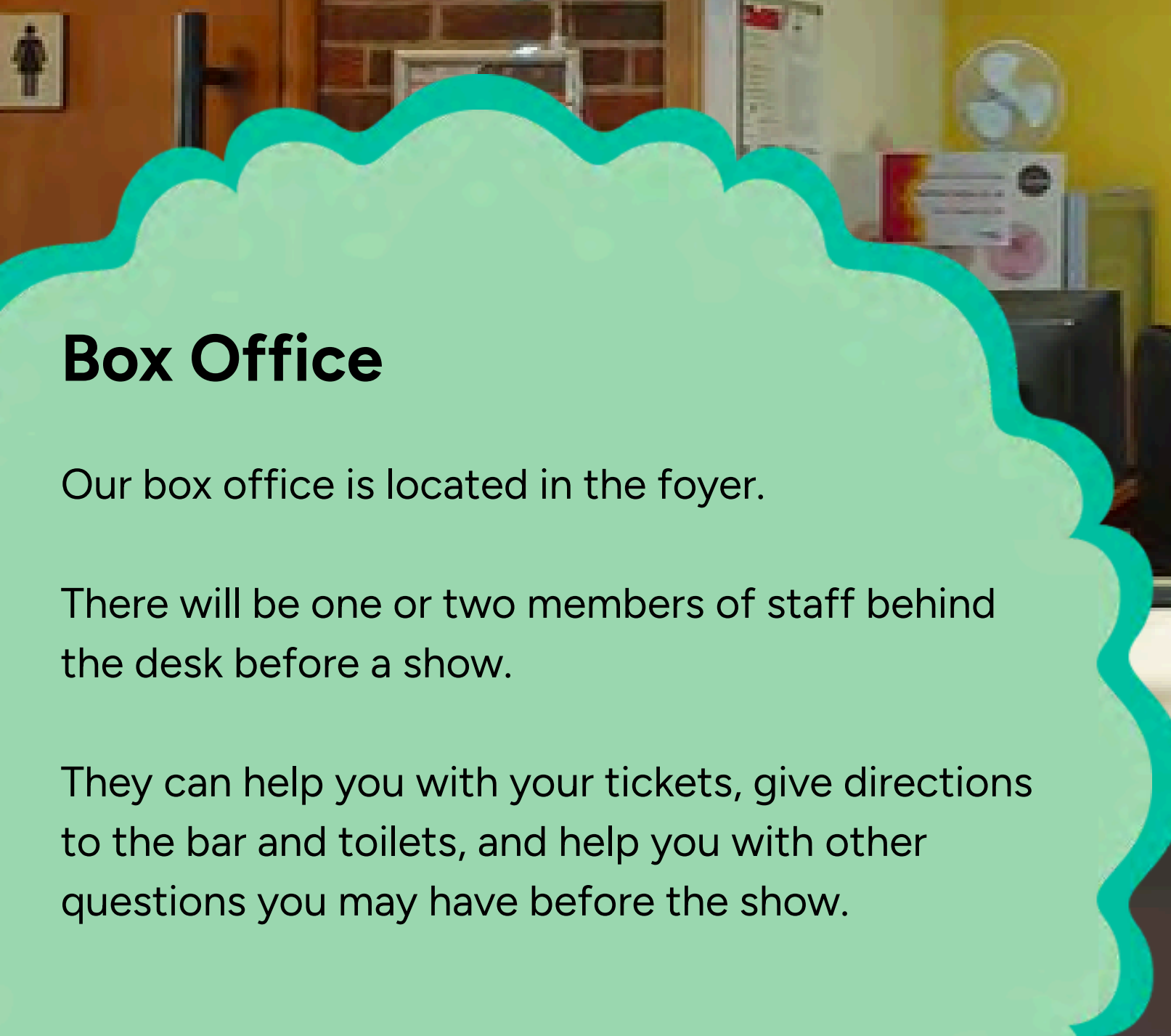


## Box Office

Our box office is located in the foyer.

There will be one or two members of staff behind the desk before a show.

They can help you with your tickets, give directions to the bar and toilets, and help you with other questions you may have before the show.

Our friendly team includes ushers, bar staff, the box office team, and student helpers.


Our staff wear yellow badges with the Turners Sims logo on it.

## Entering the Auditorium

A member of staff will announce when the doors to the auditorium are open and guests can take their seats. There are two doors to the auditorium. The seat number on your ticket will indicate which door you need to use.

There will be an usher at each door. They will ask to see your ticket and then they'll point you to your seat.



## During the Performance

Once everyone has taken their seats and the auditorium doors have been closed, the concert programmer will introduce the performer.

The audience will go quiet, the lights will dim, and the performance will start.

## During the Performance

Each performance is different, but they are likely to include some very loud moments and some very quiet ones.

The musician may talk about a piece of music before they play.





## During the Performance

Some shows are interactive.

The performers might ask you to join in by clapping along or repeating short phrases or making different noises.

You can join in as much or as little as you want to.





## Interval

Some shows have a break in the middle called an interval.

During the interval, you can remain in your seat. Or you can get a drink from the bar.

An usher will let you know when the performance is about to continue.

## The End

Once the performance has ended, the lights will come up and the audience will leave the auditorium.

Ushers will direct people towards the exit.
